




## GOVERNANCE


**Respect Everyone:** All the members of school campus should be treated with respect and dignity.

## ACTIVITY BASED & PROJECT BASED LEARNING

Activity based and project based learning refers to a learning methodology where the subject matter is delivered through various activities that make learning more interesting and engaging. In this type of learning, the student is the center of the process and the teacher acts only as a facilitator, introducing and guiding them through the activities. Students learn independently and at their own pace. Unlike conventional teaching where the teacher is the one who lectures and students are passive recipients, activity-based learning encourages children for the following at Shree Gattu Vidyalaya.

- **Engage:** Children are involved in doing the activities designed and thus engage in their own learning process
- **Experiment:** There is no standard answer to be replicated, hence children get the scope to experiment and arrive at their own solutions to a given problem
- **Explore:** Learning through activities creates curiosity in children to investigate and find more information about a given problem/situation
- **Express:** When children are thoroughly involved in the learning process it enables them to express their learning more confidently

We at Shree Gattu Vidyalaya have been at the forefront of such an enriching learning process with a multitude of our actions and activities.



Mobile Education Van project is providing supplementary educational services to government school children, adult and continuing education in 60 tribal villages in & around Ankleshwar through a very creative & innovative fun-while-you-learn approach. The project aims to build interests of young learners towards scientific growth & development and thereby contribute to nation building in the long run. The Mobile Education Van Project covers 4 blocks of Bharuch district. The project addresses educational needs of the out of school and in-school children both.

**Objectives**


1. To provide better learning opportunities to government school children.
2. To provide learn-with-fun and activity based learning opportunities with a focus on maths, science and language learning for under-privileged children attending government schools in rural & tribal areas.

The ASER Report of 2022 indicates that even though the enrolment in rural-tribal region schools of Bharuch district is 95.5%, the learning levels are of deep concern with only 20.5% of children who can do atleast subtraction studying upto std. 5<sup>th</sup> and 18.2 % who can perform division in classes 6<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>. As far as reading is concerned only 13.1% of children can read text upto Std. 2<sup>nd</sup> level and 32.8% in the same classes respectively. (<https://img.asercentre.org/docs/ASER%202022%20report%20pdfs/District%20estimates/gujarat.pdf>).

The DIET (District Institute of Education & Training) of the Govt. of Gujarat reports on 70.40% literacy rate in the rural areas of Bharuch district. (<http://dietbharuch.org/DistrictProfile/Demography.aspx>).

The Census of India, 2011 reports The total literacy rate of Ankleshwar Taluka is 85.74%. The male literacy rate is 79.51% and the female literacy rate is 70.69% in Ankleshwar Taluka. (<https://www.censusindia.co.in/subdistrict/ankleshwar-taluka-bharuch-gujarat-3918>).

These data are alarming and necessitating a focussed intervention to cater to the learning needs of the children.







## Health Camps






Vital Beam - Top model from Varian LINAC machine




**Various therapies provided to 1,850 cancer patients**


When it comes to cancer care especially the radiation therapy and chemotherapy, the patients and their care takers need to regularly visit our facility for the continuous treatment. As the patients come from lower economic strata, their access to incomes is already limited. Moreover, they stand to lose on the income on the days of treatment and same happens with their care takers accompanying the patients. The far-flung distances from where they come for treatment adds to their cost of travel by road or rail giving the patients a lot of psycho-somatic stress. This has a bearing on the treatment outcomes also.

To address such a dire need, the hospital proposes to build a patient accommodation facility at our premises that would not only provide the patients and their care takers a sense of security but also ease their challenges of regular accessibility and psycho-somatic stress of travel and cost of rental accommodation elsewhere during the course of treatment. This facility will be able to house 60 patients and their care takers, who can also have easy access to nutritive food in the adjacent hospital canteen as well as can have a serene stay with the Sarva Mangal Udyan (a cancer survivor supported green belt) just opposite to the accommodation facility. 
## Chemo Therapy Ward



## MISSION EYE & LEPROSY - 2026



An Initiative By Smt. Jayaben Mody Multispeciality Hospital

Stakeholder engagement and collaboration is essential to any positive progressive effort especially when it is in the health care domain. The hospital has taken up Mission Cataract Free Bharuch and Mission Leprosy Free Bharuch by the year 2026 and in this direction, we have onboarded various stakeholders from the District administration, Gram Vikas Trust, A. J. Mandal, Sankalp Foundation, social groups and experts. These include Mr. G. M. Patel, Deepak Nahar, Mr. Ramesh Kasandra, Mr. Vinod Jain, Mr. Kamlesh Dand, Mr. Suresh Nahar, Mr. Gautam Mehta, Dr. Hina Dhruv, Mrs. Jigisha Jhala, Dr. Raivshankar Jha, Mr. Kamal Shah, Dr. Sushant, Dr. Vipul, Mr. Sunil Chauhan and Mr. Sanjay Talati.

The working group formed of above stakeholders has been taking pains for training and awareness generation regarding leprosy and blindness prevention as well as treatment. Several trainings have been organised with the ASHA workers and anganwadi workers of various PHCs in Ankleshwar, Netrang and Valia blocks to make them aware about the primary diagnosis and identification as well as a door-to-door surveillance is also being undertaken in Jitali, Mandva, Panoli, Matiyed, Dhanturiya, Valiya, Kondh, Mauza-kavchiya, Moriyana, Bilohi and Kara. Villages. The surveillance exercise identified 172 persons in need of eye care support and 471 suspected cases of leprosy, while mega ophthalmic camps conducted at Paniyadra, Panoli, Kharod, Dehli, Dahej identified 71 individuals in need of cataract surgery of which one has been successfully operated upon.

The project has identified 34 patients for cataract surgery and 4 for keratoplasty. The keratoplasty for one eye was successfully carried out for Mr. Mahendrasinh Bahadursinh Rana aged 52 years, a resident of Dahej village, who was treated for corneal opacity with a transplant.

## Occupational Health Centre

The Occupational Health Centre of Smt. Jayaben Mody Hospital managed by Ankleshwar Industrial Development Society was functional since 1997, being the first of its kind in the state of Gujarat. In 2022, Sajjan India Ltd. supported the upgrade of the OHC.

The facilities at the newly developed occupational health centre include US ANSI standard based audiometry chamber for ear examination with Italian make machine, Italian make PFT machine for checking lung capacity, USA make Titmus company machine for eye examination with vision test, peripheral vision investigations like depth perception, phoria, night vision, and an ECG machine in which a person's ECG is recorded in digital form by wearing a belt.

Importantly X-ray, laboratory facilities are also done within this OHC so that the work of the person coming for examination is completed at one place. Also, all reports are given based on Factory Act standard and OSHAS standard of US. These facilities are proving to be a boon to all the industrial workers and personnel in securing, maintaining, and promoting their right to health which is not just a compliance to the existing laws of the land but also in consonance with the Sustainable Development Goals.








### Health Centre at Jhagadia Industries Association, Jhagadia







Additionally, to promote and support Indian culture and related activities we have an air-conditioned multi-media enabled auditorium with a seating capacity of 392.


