



Key Initiatives & Milestones

• Adopting the 5S Methodology

This year, we embraced the internationally acclaimed “5S” methodology to optimize our campus environment and workflows. The five principles – Sort (remove unnecessary items), Set in Order

(organize remaining items), Shine (clean and maintain the workspace), Standardize (establish routines and procedures), and Sustain (continuously monitor and improve) – have been adopted to keep our school spaces well-organized and efficient. Implementing the 5S system has motivated our staff and students to maintain a clean, orderly environment, making daily routines more manageable and productive.



- **Going Global: British Council STEM Collaboration**

Shree Gattu Vidyalaya went global through a new collaboration with the British Council’s international education program supported by Formula 1. As part of this “STEM Futures” challenge, inspired by exclusive Formula 1 insights, our students (aged 7-16) are working on projects that develop key STEM skills and knowledge of real-world applications. This program has ignited our learners’ passion for science and technology, offering them a unique opportunity to collaborate and innovate while gaining employability skills for future careers.



- **Introduction of the Commerce Stream**

We expanded our academic offerings by introducing a Commerce stream in the higher secondary section. The first batch of Commerce students commenced studies in the academic year 2024–25, marking a new chapter for the school. With guidance from highly qualified faculty in business, finance, and accounting, we are confident that this program will produce excellent board results in the coming years and prepare students for careers in the commercial and corporate world.

- **Formation of the Mothers' Club**

On 15th August 2024, Independence Day, we launched the Mothers' Club to enhance parent-teacher interaction. This initiative provides a platform for mothers to collaborate closely with the school in addressing student development and welfare. Through the Mothers' Club, parents and teachers engage in regular dialogue, clear up miscommunications, and work together on school events. This reciprocal association has already begun to foster better discipline, mutual respect, and a supportive "school family" environment for our children.

- **First CBSE Class X Board Examination Batch**

A significant milestone this year is that our first batch of Class X CBSE students will be appearing for their Board examinations. The school has spared no effort in preparing them for this important academic step. From 20th–25th January 2025, comprehensive internal assessments were conducted to evaluate and ready the students. We are proud of our pioneer CBSE batch and extend our best wishes to them for success in the upcoming Board exams.

- **Hosting a NEET Examination Center**

In 2024–25, Shree Gattu Vidyalaya had the honor of serving as an examination center for the NEET (National Eligibility cum Entrance Test). This was the first time a NEET exam center was established in Ankleshwar, making it a prestigious moment for both our school and the city. Our team worked diligently to meet the strict standards required for this national-level exam. An orientation program for the exam supervisors was conducted by the NEET City Coordinator (our Campus Director, Ms. Michelle Ganeshani) to ensure smooth and fair conduct of the test. Successfully hosting the NEET exam has opened a new chapter in the school's journey and set a benchmark for operational excellence.

Infrastructure and Safety Enhancements

- **Safe and Secure Environment**

Every student deserves to feel safe and valued at school. We strictly adhere to child safety norms and guidelines such as the POCSO Act, and maintain a zero-tolerance policy towards bullying or any form of abuse. Our campus is monitored by a network of CCTV cameras installed throughout the

premises (covering both the CBSE and GSEB sections). Designated staff members actively monitor these feeds to promptly address any untoward incident or emergency. These measures ensure that Shree Gattu Vidyalaya remains a hub of learning that is free from fear and harm.



• **State-of-the-Art Laboratories**

Hands-on learning is facilitated by our well-equipped laboratories. Our Computer Labs (separate for CBSE and GSEB wings) collectively accommodate over sixty students at a time, providing ample opportunity for each child to develop digital literacy and technological skills. In the sciences, we have dedicated Physics, Chemistry, and Biology laboratories where students engage in experiments and practicals that bring theoretical concepts to life. These labs nurture scientific inquiry and critical thinking, preparing students for future academic and career pursuits in science and technology.





• Library – A Temple of Learning

Our school library is truly a temple of learning, housing a vast collection of books and learning materials. From academic texts to novels, biographies to reference books, and periodicals to encyclopedias – the library caters to readers of all ages and interests. By encouraging regular library visits and reading programs, we foster a love for reading among students. The library serves not just as a resource center for studies, but also as a gateway to imagination, knowledge, and lifelong learning. (As Carl T. Rowan said, “The library is the temple of learning, and learning has liberated more people than all the wars in history.”)



• New Cafeteria and Dining Hall

This year, we opened a fully furnished cafeteria within the school premises to provide healthy, fresh meals and snacks to students. The kitchen is maintained with the highest standards of hygiene – it is sanitized daily and all food is prepared with a focus on nutrition. The spacious dining hall can accommodate a large number of students at once, allowing them to enjoy their meals in a clean and comfortable environment. The cafeteria's introduction has been warmly received, as it ensures students have convenient access to nutritious food during the school day.



Inclusive Infrastructure

In line with our commitment to inclusivity, the school installed a gentle-graded ramp to make classrooms and facilities accessible to students with physical mobility needs. The ramp has been constructed with proper safety features, including handrails and non-slip surfaces, allowing students who use wheelchairs or have difficulty with stairs to move around the campus with ease and participate fully in all school activities.

• Sports Facilities and Coaching

Physical education is strongly supported through our sports infrastructure. We maintain a comprehensive range of sports equipment for games such as football, basketball, cricket, athletics, skating, and swimming, among others. Regular investments are made to expand and update this equipment inventory. The school also benefits from access to the adjacent D.A. Anandpura Sports Complex for larger events and specialized training. Experienced coaches in various sports work with our students – some through partnerships with external sports organizations – ensuring that every child can receive proper guidance and coaching in the sport of their interest. This robust sports infrastructure underpins our students' outstanding performances and enthusiasm in sports activities.

Celebrations of Important Days

• Hindi Diwas

To commemorate the adoption of Hindi as one of India's official languages, the school celebrated Hindi Diwas. Students prepared skits, dances, and even short plays in Hindi to showcase the richness of our national language. The classrooms and bulletin boards were adorned with Hindi poems, quotes, and essays. - **General Knowledge Day**

To foster curiosity about the world, a General Knowledge (G.K.) Day was observed for our primary students. Children in classes I to III, along with enthusiastic kindergarteners, worked on simple projects and charts about current events, famous personalities, and world wonders. They then presented their projects in class, proudly sharing facts and stories. This activity, besides being fun, aimed to make our young learners more aware of the world beyond their immediate surroundings.

- **World Food Day**

Students of classes VI to X observed World Food Day by engaging in thought-provoking classroom debates on topics such as “The Importance of a Balanced Diet” and “Organic Farming as the Future of Sustainable Agriculture.” These discussions educated students on nutritional needs and global food challenges, encouraging them to adopt healthy eating habits and be mindful of food wastage.

- **Joy of Giving Week**

In the month of October, our school organized a “Joy of Giving” week to cultivate empathy and generosity. Students brought in non-perishable food items, which were later distributed to underprivileged members of the community. Through this act of giving, our students learned first-hand about kindness and the joy that comes from helping others.

- **National Milk Day**

To honor Dr. Verghese Kurien (the architect of India’s White Revolution), National Milk Day was celebrated. A representative from Amul, the dairy cooperative, visited our school and gave an engaging talk about Dr. Kurien’s contributions and the importance of milk in our diet. Students participated in a drawing competition on the theme of dairy farming and nutrition, which made them appreciate the journey of milk from farm to table.



- **Constitution Day**

On the same day, the school community observed Constitution Day. During a special morning assembly, students and teachers gathered to read the Preamble of the Indian Constitution together. This collective recitation was a solemn reminder of our fundamental principles and citizens' duties. It instilled in students a respect for the constitution and a sense of pride in being part of the world's largest democracy.



- **NEP “Bagless Day”**

In line with the National Education Policy's vision of experiential learning, the last day of 2024 was declared a “Bagless Day” for all students. Instead of regular classes and textbooks, a series of enriching activities were organized from morning until noon. Students of classes I to V enjoyed an animated movie screening at the D.A. Anandpura Children's Theater. Across the school, children participated in traditional games, watched a lively puppet show, went on a guided nature walk around the campus, and shared stories in peer storytelling sessions. Dance and music activities kept the energy high, and a yoga session allowed students to relax. Older students also used part of the day for rehearsals for the upcoming Annual Function. The Bagless Day was a refreshing break from routine and demonstrated how learning can happen in many fun and interactive ways outside of textbooks.

- **National Youth Day**

To commemorate the birthday of Swami Vivekananda, a special assembly was held. A student of Class VIII delivered an inspiring speech on Swami Vivekananda's life and teachings, emphasizing youth empowerment and character-building. The assembly served to motivate our students to uphold the values of discipline, leadership, and service championed by Swami Vivekananda.

- **National Voters' Day**

On National Voters' Day, students of classes VI to X participated in a pledge ceremony to mark the foundation day of the Election Commission of India. At 11 AM, all eligible senior students and staff took a pledge to uphold the democratic process by exercising their right to vote responsibly when the time comes. This observance educated our future voters about the value of each vote and encouraged them to be active participants in India's democracy.





Co-curricular Activities and Clubs

Shree Gattu Vidyalaya offers a rich array of co-curricular activities that complement the academic curriculum and contribute to students' holistic development. Through these activities and clubs, children develop confidence, leadership, teamwork, and various life skills while pursuing their interests.

Throughout the year, students engaged in numerous hands-on projects. For instance, as part of a gardening activity, students helped tend to the school gardens – watering plants, weeding, and learning the basics of cultivation – which connected them with nature and taught responsibility. In a creative craft session focused on sustainability, they learned to make sturdy paper bags from old newspapers, promoting recycling and an eco-friendly mindset. To instill patriotism, a flag-making activity was organized where children enthusiastically crafted the Indian tricolor flag with paper and colors. They waved their self-made flags with pride, which deepened their emotional connection to the nation's symbols.



We also encourage students to take ownership of their school environment. One initiative involved groups of students painting a school wall with educational and inspirational art, adding a personal touch to the campus. Similarly, a "thought of the day" blackboard was introduced, and students take turns writing meaningful quotes on it each morning. These activities not only beautified the school premises but also gave students a sense of pride and belonging, as they saw their contributions become a lasting part of the school.






To nurture language and communication skills, the school conducted storytelling sessions and creative writing exercises. Students practiced the art of storytelling by narrating tales in front of their peers, using expressive voices and gestures to captivate the audience – a timeless tradition that hones public speaking and imagination. They also experimented with writing HAIKU poems – one of the shortest forms of poetry originating from Japan – learning to express their thoughts and feelings in just a few syllables. These activities made language learning fun and engaging.



Reading for pleasure is strongly promoted across all grades. We hold monthly “Drop Everything And Read” (DEAR) sessions where classes from I to IX spend dedicated time immersed in books of their choice. Following these sessions, selected students share brief book reviews with their classmates, which not only improves their comprehension and speaking skills but also inspires others to read those books. Additionally, our students participate in the Junior Book Lovers’ Forum sponsored by the Rotary Club of Ankleshwar, held at the local UPL library. One notable example is from 30th November 2024, when Master Atharva Tiwari of Class VII-A eloquently presented a review of his favorite book to an audience of fellow young readers. Such platforms have been instrumental in cultivating a love for reading and honing our students’ analytical and presentation skills.

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We often refer to our students as our “curious, clever, creative children,” especially when we see them light up with joy during these activities. Whether they are playing a new sport, creating art, tending a garden, or performing on stage, their enthusiasm is infectious and reaffirms our belief that education is not just about textbooks, but also about these joyous experiences that shape their character and skills.

In addition to in-school activities, our students and staff also actively participated in community events. Notably, over 200 students and 67 teachers of Shree Gattu Vidyalaya ran together in the Asian Paints Ankleshwar International Marathon (3.0) this year. By participating in this city-wide marathon, they demonstrated exemplary team spirit and learned the value of fitness, endurance, and camaraderie outside the school setting. The sight of our large contingent running with determination for a healthy cause was a proud moment for the school.

• Values and Social Responsibility Initiatives

This aspect of our school life is interwoven through many events described above, such as the Swachhata cleanliness drive on Gandhi Jayanti, Joy of Giving Week, Partition Day awareness, voter education pledges, etc. We ensure that values of empathy, patriotism, and civic responsibility are instilled through each of these activities. Every cultural or co-curricular event at Shree Gattu Vidyalyaya carries a lesson in values – be it caring for the environment, helping the community, or honoring our nation’s heritage. The detailed narratives in the previous sections illustrate how our celebrations and observances are designed to inculcate social responsibility and moral values in our students.



• Student Leadership and Engagement

A highlight at the beginning of each academic year is the Investiture Ceremony, which formally entrusts selected students with leadership roles. During this ceremonious event, the newly elected School Captain, House Captains, prefects, and club leaders don their badges of office and take an oath to lead and serve their peers. The Investiture Ceremony not only recognizes these students as role models, but also marks the start of their journey in school governance – organizing events, maintaining discipline, and being the voice of the student body. By giving students these responsibilities, we nurture their leadership skills, accountability, and confidence.



To further develop leadership qualities, the school organized a dedicated Leadership Workshop for senior students. Led by an expert trainer, Mrs. Kinjal Shah, this interactive program engaged students of Classes XI and XII in activities that honed their communication, team management, and problem-solving abilities. Through role-playing and group challenges, participants learned what it takes to be an effective leader – both in school and beyond. The workshop was instrumental in helping our prospective graduates build the soft skills and mindset required to take on leadership roles in the future. Students emerged from the session feeling inspired and better equipped to lead initiatives and work collaboratively.

• Competitions and Academic Enrichment

To celebrate our national language and test students' knowledge of it, a special **Hindi Diwas Quiz** was organized. Students from different streams (CBSE and GSEB, both English and Gujarati mediums) were mixed into teams named after famous Hindi authors and poets, creating an atmosphere of unity in diversity. The quiz covered various facets of Hindi literature – from grammar and vocabulary to idioms, proverbs, and cultural history. The participants were completely engrossed, tackling challenging questions while also cheering on their teammates. Winning and losing took a back seat as the emphasis was on learning and enjoying the rich heritage of Hindi. Uniquely, this event was combined with a **Grandparents' Day** celebration; many students' grandparents were invited to watch the quiz in our Diamond Jubilee Theater. The presence of the grandparents and even their participation in a fun post-quiz yoga session added warmth to the occasion and bridged generational bonds.



A **Science Quiz** was also held for students of Classes I to IX from both CBSE and GSEB. This science quiz challenged the young minds with questions that required analytical thinking, application of concepts, and recall of interesting scientific facts. Students could be seen huddling and excitedly discussing each question, which ranged across physics, chemistry, biology, and general science. The quiz not only tested their knowledge but also ignited curiosity-many students remarked that they learned new scientific trivia during the event.



To develop articulate communication and showcase artistic talents, we conducted both an Elocution Competition and an Inter-Class Music Competition during the year. The Elocution Competition, open to Classes I through X, gave students a platform to deliver speeches on topics of their choice. They practiced voice modulation, clarity, and confidence, speaking passionately on issues ranging from environmental conservation to the importance of hard work. The exercise significantly boosted their public speaking skills. Meanwhile, in the Music Competition, students from Classes III to IX charmed us

with solo and group performances. From classical melodies to folk songs, the diversity of their musical presentations was impressive. Such cultural contests provided an opportunity for musically inclined students to shine and for others to develop an appreciation for performing arts. presentations was impressive. With an eye on holistic development, we also organized a few unconventional competitions. **A Best Salad Making** contest saw children teaming up to create nutritious and visually appealing salads. They brought a variety of fresh ingredients and demonstrated creativity in presentation, all while understanding the importance of healthy eating. The excitement was palpable as they explained the benefits of their salad ingredients to the judges – turning a culinary task into a learning experience. Additionally, in February 2025, a high-energy **Mathematics Quiz** was conducted to spark enthusiasm for math. Brain-teasers, puzzles, and rapid-fire rounds on mathematical concepts had participants on their toes. The Math Quiz encouraged students to think logically and quickly, and helped remove the fear of the subject by showing how fun and competitive math can be. By the end, many students were inspired to delve deeper into math beyond their textbooks.

Student Achievements and Honors

Our students have made us proud with their achievements in academics, science, and other scholastic endeavors this year. Early on, on 3rd May 2024, our high achievers of Classes X and XII were honored by the local newspaper Divya Bhaskar for their outstanding Board examination results – a testament to the academic excellence fostered at Shree Gattu Vidyalaya. In the realm of science and innovation, Aditya Yadav of Class XI was selected for the prestigious Future Scientists Training Program organized by SAC-ISRO (Space Applications Center – ISRO) and GUJCOST, where he spent a week (16th–23rd November) receiving mentorship from scientists – an invaluable experience that nurtures his dream of contributing to space research. Our school’s commitment to quality and innovation was also recognized at the 12th QCFI (Quality Circle Forum of India) Ankleshwar Convention, where our student team clinched multiple awards for problem-solving projects.

Groups of students represented us at the **Bal Vaigyanik Spardha**, a district-level science exhibition, presenting creative projects on themes like health, agriculture, and technology; their models and explanations were highly appreciated by judges and peers. In a related Science Fair at the Cluster Resource Center level, two of our young scientists – Jayveer Barot and Shruti Radadiya – each secured 3rd prizes for their innovative science models. Our students also excelled in academic talent search exams: in the **Bal Pratibha Shodh** competition, Aayushi Vasava achieved 1st rank at the Taluka level and 2nd at the District level, while young Vivan Dave earned a 1st rank at Taluka level. In the **Bharatiya Sanskriti Gyan Pariksha** (an examination on Indian culture and values), our school achieved a 100% success rate, with two students – Master Jainil M. Patel and Miss Aasthaba Gohil – securing top ranks, reflecting our emphasis on cultural education. Furthermore, dozens of our students participated enthusiastically in various national Olympiads (Mathematics, Science, English, Computer Science, etc.) conducted by the Science Olympiad Foundation. Many of them qualified for the second round at the state level, demonstrating competitive spirit and knowledge beyond the standard curriculum.

Our students equally distinguished themselves in cultural and co-curricular competitions against other schools. In October, a team of twelve girls from our school danced their way to victory by winning 1st place in the **Sheri Garba** competition organized by the Rotary Club of Bharuch, showcasing grace and synchronization in this traditional dance form. The same group also secured the 2nd position in a **Dussehra Garba** contest held at the ONGC Colony, Ankleshwar – earning accolades for their spirited performance. In the Bharuch District **Kala Mahakumbh** performing arts competition, two of our talents brought laurels: young **Mansi Prajapati (Class III-B)** won the 1st prize in Sugam Sangeet (light vocal music), and **Gargi Patel (Class VI-B)** achieved a 3rd prize in the Kathak dance category. Our singers have been on a winning spree; notably, **Aayushi Vasava** won multiple first-place awards in inter-school music competitions (Kala Utsav events) across the district, and **Yogita Solanki** earned a top spot in another prestigious singing contest. These cultural achievements underscore the creativity and confidence of our students, and we applaud the teachers who mentored them to success in these forums.

Sports Activities and Achievements

Sports and physical education are integral to student life at Shree Gattu Vidyalaya. Participating in sports not only improves physical fitness but also builds self-esteem, teamwork, discipline, and leadership among students. Throughout 2024–25, our students enthusiastically took part in numerous sports events, both within the school and at inter-school competitions, demonstrating true sportsmanship and bringing home many accolades.

Our under-14 Football Team represented the school in the SGFI (School Games Federation of India) Football Tournament held at the D.A. Anandpura Sports Complex on 10th October. They played with great energy and teamwork against strong contenders from other districts. In late October, our school also proudly hosted an Inter-House Football Competition, fostering healthy rivalry among the four houses. A prize distribution ceremony for the winners of our inter-house Football and Chess tournaments took place on 25th October at the Diamond Jubilee Theater, graced by Chief Guest Shri. Deepak Ruparel and other dignitaries – an event where parents cheered on the young champions.

Beyond football, our students ventured into other sports at higher levels: three of our boys (Mahin Patel, Abhishek Pal, and Sahil Yadav) were selected for the Bharuch district Hockey team and competed in the State Hockey Tournament in Surat on 24th–25th October. They gained valuable experience and even celebrated a win in their first match against a reputed team. In athletics, a group of five athletes qualified for the Gyan Sarovar Sahodaya Athletics Meet in Vadodara on 26th November; notably, Miss Radhika Prajapati of Class VII sprinted to a silver medal in the 100m race, showcasing her talent among regional competitors. Meanwhile, in New Delhi, our karate champ Master Dhruv Sanyal of Class V participated in the National Karate Championship (KIO Federation Cup) from 19th–23rd November and earned a bronze medal in his age category, making us extremely proud.

Within the school, we maintained a busy calendar of sports contests to involve as many students as possible. Inter-House competitions were organized regularly in disciplines like Chess, Football, Lawn Tennis, and even Skating. Every month, students looked forward to these contests where they could exhibit their skills and enjoy the thrill of competition in a friendly setting. Strict safety protocols and fair play guidelines were followed during all events, ensuring that sportsmanship remained the central value. These in-house events often served as practice grounds that prepared our students for external competitions.

Our young athletes' dedication translated into remarkable achievements in various tournaments this year. Some of the major sports honors won by our school are listed below:

- Under-14 Girls Basketball Team – Runners-Up (2nd Place) in District Khel Mahakumbh (won ₹12,000 cash prize).
- Under-14 Boys Hockey Team – 3rd Place in District Khel Mahakumbh (won ₹16,000 cash prize).
- Under-14 Girls Basketball (School Games) – Runners-Up in District Tournament (4 girls from the team selected for state-level trials).
- Under-17 Girls Kho-Kho Team – 2nd Place in Taluka Khel Mahakumbh (won ₹6,000 cash prize).
- Under-11 Swimming (Boys) – Master Rudra Dixit – 2nd Place (Silver) in Free-Style at District Khel Mahakumbh (won ₹3,000 cash prize).
- Under-15 Girls Football Team – Runners-Up in Khelo India – Asmita Women's Football League (awarded Silver medals, Runners-Up Trophy & ₹30,000 prize).
- Under-13 Girls Football Team – Reached finals in Khelo India league; awarded special recognition and certificates for outstanding performance.
- Lawn Tennis (Under-12) – Miss Kavya Shah – Runners-Up in Beginners Club Inter-School Tournament (Trophy).
- Lawn Tennis (Under-10) – Master Aayansh Moralia – Runners-Up in Beginners Club Inter-School Tournament (Medal).
- Inter-School Cricket – Master Ashmit Pandey (Class XI) was named “Man of the Match” in the Lions Club Cup Cricket Tournament for his all-round performance.
- Athletics (80m Hurdles, Boys) – Master Tanay Patel – 1st Place (Gold) at Taluka Khel Mahakumbh; Master Armaan Kachwala – 2nd Place (Silver) at Taluka Khel Mahakumbh.
- Selections: Several of our players (including members of the Under-17 and Under-14 Girls Basketball teams) were selected to represent Ankleshwar at Zonal-level competitions – a testament to their skill and potential.

These victories have imbued the school with immense pride and have inspired many other students to actively participate in sports. We remain committed to providing our athletes with top-notch coaching and facilities, and we look forward to building on this legacy of sporting excellence in the years to come.

Field Trips, Workshops and Career Guidance

Outside the classroom, our students engaged in several educational trips and workshops designed to broaden their horizons and prepare them for the future. On 18th October 2024, students of Classes X and XII (CBSE & GSEB) visited UPL University for an insightful field trip. They toured advanced laboratories and got hands-on exposure to college-level science and engineering facilities. After the lab visits, the university organized a career guidance session in their conference hall where our students learned about various fields of study and were encouraged to align their strengths with potential career paths. The day also featured a fire safety drill demonstration on campus, which equipped our students with practical knowledge of handling emergencies. To top it off, the UPL University team treated our students to a delicious meal in their canteen, making the trip both educational and enjoyable.



On 21st November 2024, a special seminar on “Career Opportunities in the Aviation Sector” was held at our Diamond Jubilee Children’s Theatre, conducted by experts from the Western India Institute of Aeronautics (WIIA). Students of Classes X to XII were thrilled to learn about the diverse careers in aviation – from pilots and air traffic controllers to aircraft maintenance engineers. The interactive session, complete with videos of aircraft and airports, expanded their understanding of this exciting field.



Our school also prioritized life skills and personal development through various guest lectures and workshops. **Health and Nutrition:** A workshop on adolescent nutrition was led by Dr. Stuti Patel, who educated our students about the unique dietary needs during teenage years and how to maintain a balanced diet for healthy growth



Leadership Skills: In addition to the student leadership workshop by Mrs. Kinjal Shah our faculty invited one of our accomplished alumni, Mr. Ishan Modi, to speak with students. On 15th October 2024, Mr. Modi – now an American business finance planner – held a motivational talk with our Class IX and X students, sharing anecdotes of his school days at Shree Gattu Vidyalaya and giving practical advice on setting goals and pursuing them diligently.



Value-based education remained a constant throughout the year. **Spiritual and Ethical Discourse:** A team from ISKCON visited our school every Friday and Saturday to conduct short discourses from the Bhagavad Gita for interested students. These sessions, often filled with storytelling and question-answers, highlighted how purity of thought and strong values can guide one's life.



Civic awareness was also encouraged. For instance, our Class IX and X students participated in a live online session on **Electoral Literacy** organized by CBSE, which deepened their understanding of democratic processes and the importance of voting. Meanwhile, our newly inducted Class XI students took part in a Viksit Bharat – Young Leaders Dialogue program initiated by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports. They engaged in quizzes, essay-writing, and presentations about India's vision for 2047, learning how young people can contribute to a developed and self-reliant India.





As the academic year progressed and final exams approached, mental well-being became a focus. A seminar on Exam Stress Management was conducted by JCI member Mr. Darshan Jani, who taught students practical techniques to cope with exam anxiety – from time management and relaxation exercises to the importance of seeking support from friends, family, or teachers when feeling overwhelmed. Additionally, a special talk on adolescent health and hygiene was arranged for our girl students:



Mrs. Jigisha Jhala addressed 114 female students, candidly discussing challenges faced during adolescence (especially menstrual health) and clearing doubts in a very supportive environment.

Finally, on 30th January 2025, our school's staff and a group of Class IX students were invited to observe the Emergency Response Team (ERT) Competition hosted by UPL at the Ankleshwar Sports Complex. Nineteen industrial units were demonstrating their emergency preparedness through mock drills. Our students watched attentively as scenarios like fire-fighting and first-aid were enacted by professionals. Special thanks were given to Shri Nathubhai Dodia of UPL's CSR department, who took the time to explain each drill and safety measure to our students. This unique exposure instilled in them an appreciation for industrial safety and the importance of being prepared for emergencies.



Teacher Training and Capacity Building

Our educators continually update their skills to provide the best learning experience for our students. In December 2024, a series of ICT (Information and Communication Technology) training sessions was conducted on the 5th, 12th, and 19th of the month by faculty from UPL University for all teachers of both CBSE and GSEB wings. In these hands-on sessions, teachers learned to integrate new digital tools into their lesson plans, explored educational software, and enhanced their own digital literacy—an effort to keep teaching methods in step with the changing technological landscape.

We have in place a continuous Teacher Capacity Building program, under which various workshops and seminars are organized. As part of this program, a special subject-enrichment seminar was held for our Science and Mathematics teachers. Experts Prof. K. N. Joshipura and Mr. Vipul (senior faculty associated with UPL University and the District Education Office) – conducted an intensive workshop focusing on innovative teaching methodologies in Physics and Mathematics. They shared new approaches to explaining complex concepts, demonstrated simple experiments and activities that teachers could use in class, and discussed common misconceptions students have in these subjects and how to address them. This collaboration not only bolstered our teachers’ content knowledge but also connected them with a broader network of educators and resources.

Throughout the year, our teachers also participated in various webinars and training modules recommended by CBSE and the Gujarat State Education Board, covering topics from inclusive education practices to effective evaluation techniques. By investing in our teachers’ professional development, we ensure that they remain well-equipped with modern pedagogical skills and are inspired to deliver high-quality education. These efforts directly benefit our students, as engaged and up-to-date teachers create a more dynamic and effective classroom environment.

Annual Day Celebration

Annual functions in schools are an essential part of the educational experience, promoting school spirit, creativity, and community engagement while celebrating achievements and creating lasting memories. They showcase the talents of students and teachers, and strengthen the bond of the entire school family.

Our **12th Annual Day Function** was celebrated on 15th January 2025 with great pomp and enthusiasm. The theme of the annual function was “Bharuch – Samruddhi Aur Sanskruti Ki Virasat” (Bharuch – Legacy of Prosperity and Culture). The event was graced by Shri D.K. Rana as the Chief Guest and Shri Himat Sheladia as the Guest of Honour. Students of classes VI to XII took the stage in a vibrant cultural program that reflected the rich heritage of our region. There were folk dances, drama sketches about the history of Bharuch, and musical performances, all woven around the central theme. The audience – comprising parents, invited dignitaries, and alumni – was visibly impressed by the confidence and skill displayed by our senior students in these performances.

Later in January, it was the turn of our younger stars. Children of the Pre-Primary and Primary sections (Nursery up to Class V) had their Annual Day towards the end of the month. Each grade

level presented performances on distinct themes, allowing even the tiniest ones to shine on stage. The themes were diverse and imaginative – from a tribute to the **National Education Policy** by one group (showcasing through skits how new learning methods are fun), to an energetic depiction of the grand **Maha Kumbh** festival by another. A.I.D.S. Mobile Education Van

Since 2001

The Mobile Education Van Project is a dynamic educational initiative reaching 60 villages across four blocks of Bharuch district. Designed to meet the learning needs of both out-of-school and in-school children, the project provides accessible, inclusive education to underserved communities.

This is the only mobile education initiative in Bharuch district, serving over 10,000 children and ensuring that quality education reaches even the most remote areas. Spearheaded by Mrs. Meera Panjwani and Mrs. Geeta Srivatsan, the project is run by a committed team of trained educators who facilitate learning sessions throughout the day based on a well-structured schedule.

Session 1 – Assembly and Value-Based Engagement Objectives:

- To help children manage stress through mindfulness and routine
- To instil strong moral values and ethical behaviour
- To foster a spirit of unity, tolerance, and social harmony
- To create an engaging, joyful, and participatory learning atmosphere



Activities

1. Clap Games – To Improve Focus and Coordination

Clap games are rhythmic activities involving hand movements and pattern-based clapping, often paired with songs or rhymes. These games:

- Enhance fine and gross motor skills through hand-eye coordination.
- Improve attention span and concentration by requiring children to follow and repeat sequences.
- Promote social interaction and cooperation when played in groups.
- Reinforce memory skills as children recall patterns and sequences.

Clap games make learning interactive and fun while subtly teaching control, rhythm, and teamwork.

2. Yoga – Promoting Physical Well-being and Emotional Balance

Yoga is a holistic physical activity that integrates movement, breathing, and mindfulness. In young children, yoga:

- Develops strength, flexibility, and balance through safe, age-appropriate poses.
- Improves focus and self-regulation, aiding classroom behavior and academic performance.

- Supports emotional stability by helping children manage anxiety, anger, and stress.
 - Encourages self-awareness and body positivity, which are vital during formative years.
- Introducing yoga in primary education helps build lifelong habits of physical and mental wellness.

3. Om Chanting – Encouraging Calmness and Mental Clarity

Chanting "Om" is a simple meditative practice that helps children center their thoughts and calm their minds. Its benefits include:

- Creating a sense of inner peace and relaxation, preparing students for learning.
- Stimulating the vagus nerve, which supports emotional regulation.
- Enhancing concentration and mental clarity.
- Promoting a collective sense of unity when done in groups, fostering community spirit.

Om chanting, though brief, has powerful impacts on emotional and mental preparedness for the school day.

4. Prayer and Hymns – Nurturing Spiritual Grounding and Discipline

Incorporating daily prayer and hymns into the school routine:

- Encourages discipline, routine, and a sense of respect.
- Nurtures spiritual awareness and promotes moral development.
- Fosters a sense of gratitude, humility, and empathy.
- Builds cultural identity and connects children with heritage and traditions.

This practice contributes to the moral and ethical development of children, forming a balanced worldview

5. Trivia Sharing – Sparking Curiosity and General Knowledge

Trivia sharing sessions offer short, interesting facts that:

- Stimulate curiosity and a love for learning beyond textbooks.
- Expand general knowledge and awareness of the world.
- Encourage public speaking, listening, and questioning skills.
- Build confidence in expressing ideas in front of peers.

These sessions can be a stepping stone toward research skills and lifelong learning enthusiasm.

6. Riddles – Stimulating Logical Thinking and Problem-solving

Riddles are fun and engaging tools that challenge the brain. They:

- Boost logical reasoning, critical thinking, and creativity.
- Encourage analytical thought and persistence in finding answers.
- Improve language and vocabulary skills.
- Provide a non-threatening way to experience problem-solving and cognitive development.

They make learning fun while developing mental agility in young minds.

7. Storytelling – Imparting Values, Enhancing Listening and Imagination

Storytelling is a timeless educational tool that:

- Enriches language development and vocabulary acquisition.
- Enhances listening skills, attention span, and comprehension.
- Conveys moral values and life lessons in a memorable way.
- Sparks imagination and creative thinking.
- Encourages empathy as children relate to diverse characters and experiences.

It bridges emotional, intellectual, and moral learning, making it a cornerstone of early education

8. Street Plays – Using Drama as a Medium for Social Awareness and Expression

Street plays or nukkad natak allow children to express ideas through acting. They:

- Increase confidence, stage presence, and verbal expression.
- Foster teamwork, coordination, and leadership skills.
- Raise awareness about social issues, nurturing responsible citizenship.
- Enable experiential learning by allowing children to "live" the message they portray.
- Develop emotional intelligence as they portray different characters and emotions.

This method blends art and education, making it a powerful tool for holistic learning.

Integrating these activities into the primary school curriculum fosters the holistic development of children—cognitively, emotionally, physically, socially, and morally. They go beyond rote learning and academic excellence, nurturing well-rounded individuals with essential life skills.

Session 2 – Activity-Based Learning Objectives:

- To make daily lessons more enriching, enjoyable, and interactive by using the teaching-learning materials available in the mobile van
- To encourage interest in hands-on, activity-based learning for better understanding and long-term retention of knowledge

Activities and Methodology of Mobile Classrooms: Fostering Meaningful and Engaging Learning

The mobile classroom initiative delivers subject-specific educational support in Gujarati, Mathematics, Science, and Social Science for students up to 8th standard. The approach is rooted in the belief that education should be accessible, engaging, and transformative—especially for children in underserved or remote areas.

Key Pedagogical Principles:

Each session is designed to achieve the following learning goals:

Conceptual Clarity Over Rote Learning

Lessons focus on building a strong understanding of fundamental concepts, ensuring students can apply their knowledge meaningfully rather than memorizing facts.

Real-Life Application of Concepts:

By relating academic content to daily life scenarios, students see the relevance of what they learn, which boosts motivation and retention.

Strengthening the 3Rs – Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic:

Foundational skills in language and numeracy are prioritized to build a strong academic base for all future learning.

Peer-Assisted Learning:

The program encourages collaborative activities, where students learn from and with each other, promoting teamwork, confidence, and social skills.

Teaching Tools and Techniques:

A blend of traditional and innovative teaching methods ensures that sessions are inclusive, dynamic, and effective:

Interactive Q&A and Group Discussions:

Promote active participation, critical thinking, and communication skills among students.

Modelling and Demonstrations:

Help clarify abstract concepts using visual and tangible examples, improving comprehension.

Traditional Methods (Chalk and Board):

Continue to play a vital role in delivering structured lessons and explanations in a familiar format.

Modern Learning Aids:

Supplement traditional methods with visuals, props, and technology to make sessions more engaging and multisensory.

Hands-on Experiments and Project-Based Learning:

Enable experiential learning, where students explore, discover, and apply knowledge in real contexts—especially effective in Science and Social Science.

Creative Assignments and Art-Integrated Learning:

Encourage self-expression, imagination, and interdisciplinary understanding, making learning joyful and personalized.

Outcome: A Holistic Learning Experience


This integrated approach ensures that education is:



Building on its foundational history of philanthropy, the hospital achieved significant milestones – expanding critical departments establishing a pioneering Geriatric Care Centre, attaining prestigious **DISH certification** for its Occupational Health Centre (OHC), and facilitating a life-saving multi-organ donation. With a robust team of specialists and staff, Smt. Jayaben Mody Multi Specialty Hospital served over **81,000** patients and conducted over **4,400** surgeries during the year. The hospital deepened its community impact through extensive health camps, cancer screening initiatives, and targeted social missions. This year solidified Smt. Jayaben Mody Multi Specialty Hospital's position as a leading multispecialty and oncology care provider – one driven by compassion, innovation, and a commitment to holistic well-being.

Institutional Profile & History

- **Origins:** Founded in response to the critical lack of government healthcare infrastructure in the rapidly developing Ankleshwar GIDC during the 1970s–80s. Initially started as a modest 25-bed facility in GIDC housing quarters through the philanthropy of the Mody family and the Unique Group of Companies, the hospital was envisioned to fill a vital healthcare gap in the community.
- **Evolution:** Inaugurated as a full-fledged hospital by the Gujarat Chief Minister in 1996, Smt. Jayaben Mody Multi Specialty Hospital progressively expanded to its current capacity of 146 beds, including the addition of a state-of-the-art Radiation Centre.
- **Current Capacity & Expertise:** Today the hospital operates 146 beds with 17 full-time specialist doctors and 26 visiting consultants across various specialties. Well-trained nursing, paramedical, operations, and administrative teams support the clinical services.
- **Core Mission:** Smt. Jayaben Mody Multi Specialty Hospital is dedicated to delivering quality medical care with 24/7 emergency services, a well-stocked pharmacy, and affordable ambulance services. It remains committed to serving humanity by promoting wellness and providing compassionate care in times of trauma, thus striving to improve health and quality of life in the community.



Organogram





Clinical Services & Performance Highlights


The hospital's clinical volume grew substantially in FY 2024–25, reflecting both increased demand and expanded service capacity:




- **Total Patients Served:** 81,171 (combined outpatient and inpatient encounters).
- **Outpatient Department Visits:** 55,054 patient visits in general and specialty OPDs.
- **Inpatient Department Admissions:** 10,561 patients admitted for hospital care.
- **J. B. Mody Cancer Centre OPD Visits:** 11,215 oncology outpatient visits at the dedicated cancer centre.




- **Specialty Clinic OPD Consultations:** 30,999 consultations in specialty-specific clinics indicating robust utilization of specialty services.



4,403 surgical procedures completed, marking an increase from the previous year and covering disciplines from general surgery to super-specialties.



7,339 patients managed in the Emergency Department, providing 24/7 urgent care for accidents, acute illnesses, and other emergencies.



The newly expanded Dialysis Unit provided life-sustaining care to patients with kidney failure. In FY 2024–25, a total of 8,071 dialysis sessions were carried out (an average of about 672 sessions per month), indicating the high demand and critical importance of this service. This reflects the hospital’s enhanced capacity after inaugurating a state-of-the-art dialysis center, and it has significantly improved access to renal care in the region. The dialysis unit served dozens of patients each month, with utilization rising steadily through the year as awareness and capacity grew.


J. B. Mody Cancer Centre

A Beacon of Comprehensive Oncology Care


- **Establishment:** Commissioned on April 19, 2022, the J. B. Mody Cancer Centre was established to address a critical need for holistic cancer care in the region. In FY 2024–25, it continued to expand services as the first NABH-accredited comprehensive cancer hospital in Bharuch and Narmada districts – a landmark achievement that assures quality and safety in oncology care.
- **Cutting-Edge Technology:** J. B. Mody Cancer Centre is equipped with advanced radiotherapy technology, notably a VitalBeam linear accelerator capable of delivering 2D-RT, 3D-CRT, IGRT, IMRT, VMAT, SBRT, SRT, and SRS treatments. This single machine can treat about 97% of all cancer types, offering world-class radiation therapy options locally.
- **Comprehensive Services:** The centre provides end-to-end oncology services under one roof:
- **Medical Oncology:** Chemotherapy administration with supportive care for toxicity management, and specialized procedures such as central line insertions, lumbar punctures, and pleural/peritoneal fluid tapping.
- **Surgical Oncology:** Expert surgical management across all major cancer types – including head & neck, breast, gastrointestinal, urologic, gynecologic, thoracic, neuro-oncology, orthopedic oncology, pediatric cancers, and reconstructive surgeries. A dedicated team performs complex oncologic surgeries as well as insertion of vascular access devices for chemotherapy.
- **Nuclear Medicine :** Using a small amount of radioactive tracer to visualize the metabolic activity of cancer cells, which can identify tumors at an early stage. The PET-CT scan, a fusion of nuclear medicine's functional imaging & a CT scan's detailed anatomical imaging, enables oncologists to precisely locate tumors, determine the cancer's stage, plan and monitor treatment, & detect any potential recurrence.
- **Radiation Oncology:** Advanced radiotherapy as noted, covering palliative to highly precise treatments (IMRT/VMAT, stereotactic radiosurgery, etc.) to target tumors while sparing healthy tissue.




Patient Statistics



1,740 individuals received treatment for various cancers over the year.



1,131 patients underwent one or more forms of therapy (chemotherapy, radiotherapy, and/or surgery) as part of their treatment plans.




Data were recorded for 1,611 treated patients to analyze outcomes and needs by gender, helping tailored community awareness and support programs.

- Philanthropic Support:** The cancer centre’s establishment and upgrades have been generously supported by philanthropic contributions – notably from the late Shri J. B. Mody and the Mody, Mehta and Dalal families via the Ansuva Mody Charitable Trust, as well as corporate donors like Lekar Pharma and J. B. Chemicals & Pharmaceuticals Ltd.. This generosity has been instrumental in acquiring modern equipment and subsidizing care for needy patients.
- Strategic Guidance:** J. B. Mody Cancer Centre acknowledges the strategic guidance received from oncology experts, including consultancy by Health Care Reforms consultants under Ms. Gayatri Singh, which has strengthened the centre’s protocols and program development.

Community Engagement & Health Initiatives


The hospital has deepened its community outreach in 2024–25, focusing on preventive care, early detection of diseases, and occupational health, often in partnership with government and NGOs. Smt. Jayaben Mody Hospital has grown from offering basic diagnostic services to becoming a center of comprehensive, community-focused healthcare. In its early years, the hospital conducted screening camps to detect common health issues among rural and industrial populations. However, it soon recognized that diagnosis without accessible treatment left many patients without hope. This realization led to a significant shift—moving from simple detection to providing a complete pathway of care. The hospital has begun organizing free comprehensive health camps that include screenings, direct treatment, and interventional procedures to ensure continuity of care for the most vulnerable. Patients identified in these camps are directly integrated into the hospital system and receive free treatment supported by donors.

Health Camps Conducted -137, 7949 Beneficiaries



A total of 137 free health camps were conducted benefiting 7,949 people in surrounding communities. These camps ranged from general medical check-ups to specialized screenings e.g. cancer detection, eye camps, significantly improving access to healthcare for underserved populations. A specialty-wise breakdown of camp types and attendance was recorded internally, indicating broad coverage of medical disciplines.


Specialty-Based Distribution of 7,949 Beneficiaries



“UMEED” Cancer Screening Campaign: A collaborative initiative with the Gujarat State Health Department, Tata Memorial Hospital & Tata Memorial Centre, aimed at “bringing cancer screening to the doorstep” of the community, with the mission to detect cancer at early stages and prevent cancer through awareness and timely treatment, thereby reducing mortality. The campaign involved online sensitization and training programs for PHC & CHC doctors, as well as ASHA workers across Bharuch and Narmada districts. Expert oncologists from JMH/TMH provided virtual training and large-scale screening drives were organized, integrating with government health infrastructure.



Excellence & Certification: The OHC earned the prestigious DISH Certification from the Directorate of Industrial Safety and Health, reflecting its high standards in occupational healthcare delivery. OHC has also been certified as an official First Aid Training center, enabling it to train industrial employees in lifesaving first aid skills on behalf of the government.

During 2024–25, the OHC provided services to 69 companies and institutes (up from 57 in the previous year), expanding its corporate client base significantly. New corporate tie-ups were established with major industrial firms such as PI Industries, Saint Gobain, Godrej Industries, Kohler India, Lanxess India, among others, for conducting pre-employment and periodic medical check-ups for their employees.



A total of 32,599 employee health examinations were conducted through the OHC in FY 2024–25 (a sharp rise from 19,914 in 2023–24). Notably, 27,706 of these examinations were carried out at the Jhagadia Industrial Association Health Centre, a satellite clinic managed by us underscoring the trust placed in JMH by the industrial community. Regular screenings covered general health, vision, hearing (audiometry), lung function, and cardiac risk, helping detect issues early.

The annual preventive screenings yielded important findings that led to prompt interventions. For instance, 11 employees were identified with positive treadmill tests (cardiac risk) in 2024–25 (versus 0 cases the previous year), and 22 cases of anemia were detected (slightly up from 18 cases in 2023–24). Encouragingly, no new occupational disease-related cancers were detected this year (down from 1 case in the prior year), reflecting effective workplace hazard mitigation and health monitoring. These results demonstrate the impact of OHC programs in safeguarding worker health.

- **Modern Chemotherapy Unit:** A dedicated, state-of-the-art chemotherapy department was opened, providing a comfortable and safe environment for cancer patients to receive systemic therapy. This unit enables delivery of complex chemo regimens under close monitoring by oncologists and trained oncology nurses. We are thankful to Sudershan Chemical Industries Ltd. for the grand support.
- **Upgraded Pathology Laboratory:** The pathology department was expanded and outfitted with the latest diagnostic technology, allowing for faster turnaround of test results and improved accuracy in diagnostics. Advanced analyzers and automation now handle higher volumes, supporting the growing clinical load. Our sincere gratitude to Gulbrandsen Technologies to aid the lab upgradation.
- **Expanded CSSD (Central Sterile Services Dept.):** The sterile processing unit was enlarged and modernized to strengthen infection control. New high-capacity autoclaves and strict protocols have enhanced the sterilization of surgical instruments, thereby improving patient safety in surgeries and procedures.
- **State-of-the-Art Dialysis Center:** A new Dialysis Department was established with advanced hemodialysis machines and patient-friendly facilities. This expansion allows more patients with chronic kidney disease to receive regular dialysis in a comfortable setting, closer to home. The center's experienced nephrology team ensures high-quality care. A warm note of thanks to GRP Ltd. for their generous contribution for the renal dialysis centre.
- **Expanded Cancer OPD:** Outpatient facilities for oncology were increased, creating additional consultation rooms and infusion chairs. This has reduced wait times and improved the patient experience for those visiting the Cancer Centre for check-ups, chemotherapy, and follow-ups. The credits for this upgraded facility goes to Borosil Renewables Ltd. and Cohizon Life Sciences Ltd.
- **New Dental Department:** A fully equipped dental clinic was added, offering services from routine dental check-ups and cleanings to more advanced oral healthcare procedures. This addresses an important community need for accessible dental care within the hospital setting. We are thankful to Sudershan Chemical Industries Ltd. for the grand support.

- **Solar roof top:** The installation of a 100 kW solar rooftop system, generously supported by Lanxess India Pvt. Ltd., stands as a significant step towards promoting renewable energy and environmental sustainability. By harnessing clean solar power, the initiative not only reduces dependency on conventional fossil fuels but also helps in lowering carbon emissions and conserving natural resources.
- **Surgical Technology Advancement:** Significant capital was invested in **high-end surgical equipment** to support complex procedures. For example, new neurosurgery instruments and operating room enhancements were introduced, enabling the hospital to perform advanced neuro and spine surgeries locally. These upgrades have improved surgical precision and outcomes across various specialties. The neuro-surgical equipments have been donated by Gujarat Guardian Ltd. and we are honoured to have their continuous support since the establishment of our hospital.
- **Advanced Software System :** The generous support from BGP Health Care Limited in providing an Advanced Cancer Treatment Planning System Software has significantly enhanced the hospital's oncology services. This state-of-the-art technology enables precise treatment planning, improving accuracy in radiation therapy and minimizing side effects for patients. By integrating innovation with compassionate care, the software empowers doctors to deliver personalized treatment, ensuring better outcomes and greater hope for cancer patients.
- **6D Couch & Ambulance :** The support extended by J B Chemicals & Pharmaceuticals Ltd. through the provision of a 6D Couch & an Ambulance has greatly strengthened patient care services. The advanced 6D Couch enhances precision and comfort during critical cancer treatments, ensuring better outcomes & safety for patients. The addition of the Ambulance has further improved emergency response, enabling timely transportation and access to essential healthcare. Together, these contributions reflect a deep commitment to community well-being and bring direct, life-saving benefits to patients in need.
- **Foundation for Future Growth:** In late 2024, "**Bhoomi Poojan**" ceremony (groundbreaking) for further expansion of its facilities was held. This symbolic inauguration marked the beginning of construction for upcoming infrastructure – potentially including new inpatient wings, research labs, or training centers. This forward-looking development will ensure the hospital can meet the region's growing healthcare needs in the years ahead. - Mission “Cataract Free Bharuch” & “Leprosy Free Bharuch 2026”:** The hospital is a key stakeholder in ambitious district-wide missions to eliminate avoidable blindness due to cataract and to eradicate leprosy by 2026.
- Stakeholder Collaboration:** The hospital works closely with the District Administration and local NGOs such as Gram Vikas Trust, Andhjan Mandal, Sankalp Foundation, Jain Social Group, and other community organizations. Together, these partners coordinate resources and outreach in a collective impact model. Panoli Intermediates is the major supporter for this initiative.
- Activities:** Training sessions were conducted for frontline health workers (ASHA and Anganwadi workers) across multiple blocks including Ankleshwar, Netrang, Hansot, Bharuch, and Valia. Additionally, teams carried out door-to-door screenings in identified villages to find individuals with cataracts or leprosy for further evaluation.
- Impact:** Over 200 patients with significant cataracts were identified and scheduled for free cataract removal surgeries, and around 10 patients were identified for keratoplasty (corneal transplant) to restore vision. These efforts are restoring sight to the blind and facilitating early treatment for leprosy cases, thus preventing disabilities.

- **Transformative Care Example:** As part of the Cataract Free mission, JMH surgeons performed a complex **triple procedure** – cataract extraction with intraocular lens (IOL) implantation plus a corneal transplant – **free of cost** for a 59-year-old woman who had been blind in both eyes. This extraordinary case restored her vision and independence, vividly illustrating the life-changing impact of the mission initiatives. The success was celebrated as a milestone and showcased JMH’s surgical expertise deployed for social good.

- **Geriatric Care Certificate:** Recognizing the growing needs of the elderly, JMH established a specialized Geriatric Care program. This interdisciplinary initiative addresses the complex health issues of seniors, many of whom have multiple co-morbidities or atypical presentations of disease.



- **Course & Training:** An in-house training course in Geriatric Medicine was offered for medical residents and staff, focusing on comprehensive geriatric assessment and management. Trainees rotate through community care, inpatient wards, outpatient clinics, and even home-care scenarios to learn holistic care for the elderly.

- **Scope of Care:** The geriatric program integrates services across Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy, Physiotherapy/Occupational Therapy, Social Work, and Nutrition. Care plans address medical treatment, rehabilitation (post-stroke, fractures, etc.), long-term care planning, and even non-medical support like social services and advanced care directives.

- **Goal:** The overarching goal is to improve the quality of life and functional independence of senior citizens. By training internal medicine residents and staff in geriatrics, we are building capacity to manage an aging population in various settings – community outreach, acute hospital care, and ambulatory clinics. This forward-looking initiative positions the hospital as a leader in elder care, a service area that often remains neglected.



- **“Gift of Life” Organ Donation:** In a remarkable act of compassion, the hospital facilitated a multi-organ donation that saved several lives. After a patient was declared brain-dead, the hospital coordinated with organ retrieval teams so that the patient’s heart, lungs, kidneys, and corneas could be harvested and transplanted into waiting recipients. This was the first such multi-organ donation in the region. The donor’s family was honoured for their courage and generosity, and the case was publicized to raise awareness about organ donation. This success has inspired the hospital to promote organ donor registration and to develop protocols for future opportunities to give the “gift of life.”

- **Continuous Learning Philosophy:** A culture of continuous learning is nurtured through regular training and upskilling programs. Staff are encouraged to update their clinical knowledge and soft skills in line with the latest standards.
- **Training Programs:** A diverse array of training opportunities was offered, including hands-on clinical workshops (for example, wound care, infection control practices), certification courses for nurses and technicians, leadership development seminars for mid-level managers, and soft-skill training (communication, teamwork) for all departments. These programs aim to enhance both technical competencies and interpersonal skills among staff.
- **Highlighted Workshops:** Specific training sessions during the year included hospital-wide **Fire Safety Training** (to ensure all staff can respond to fire emergencies effectively) and **Basic Life Support (BLS) Training**, where clinical and non-clinical staff learned critical resuscitation skills. The BLS trainings were conducted per American Heart Association guidelines, equipping employees to handle cardiac arrests or choking incidents on the premises or in the community.







Additionally, to promote and support Indian culture and related activities we have an air-conditioned multi-media enabled auditorium with a seating capacity of 392.


